Down came the rain and washed the spider out.


(now bring both arms down and out to the side to wash out)

Out came the sun, and dried up all the rain,


(arms overhead in a circle for the sun)

Hey Diddle Diddle




Hey diddle diddle, the cat and the fiddle,

The little dog laughed to see such fun






Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star
